Please include a cover sheet with each proposal to provide the following information: title or topic of the proposal; category of the proposal (paper, workshop, post); names, affiliations, relevant background of all participants, address, telephone number, and e-mail address of the person submitting the proposal; and addresses, telephone numbers, and e-mail addresses of all other participants.

Proposals for teachers and teacher-educators: descriptions and explanations of three times (event 2) or five times (event 1) of 90-minute-long classes must be included.

1. Full Paper: it should be max 25.000 characters (references and spaces included)
2. An extended summary of 600–1,000 words, detailing all the aims, methodology, findings, and theoretical and educational significance of the research. Please know that this extended summary is the basis for the reviewers.
3. Full contact information, including e-mail address and affiliation, for each of the authors involved.

Depending on the format and type of research report, the proposals will be reviewed by at least two referees. In general, they apply the following criteria

- Overall quality and scientific originality
- Significance for theory, practice, and policy in Philosophy for Children
- Theoretical framework
- Clarity of definition of research questions and objectives
- Quality, validity and appropriateness of analysis
- Presentation of contents
- Interpretation of results (practical and theoretical relevance)
- Educational implication

Please note that empirical and theoretical contributions will be accepted.

An empirical contribution should focus on:

1. Relevance of the project
2. Theoretical background
3. Research questions
4. Research methods (context, participants, data sources, sampling, procedure, ethical issues)
5. Results
6. Discussion and conclusion

A theoretical contribution should focus on:

1. Relevance of the theoretical debate
2. Theoretical background/literature review
3. Position of the presenter in the debate
4. Arguments for the position
5. Relevance of the position for theory and/or practice/policy
6. Discussion and conclusion
